## This Week



After we read each story, we sang our letter sound songs and sorted pictures that began with each letter. The kiddos love reading their alphabet cheers and are doing great following along as we read them together.

This week we blasted off into space. During circle time, we learned about our galaxy and everything that it holds. First, we learned that the Sun, a giant star, is a ball of gas in the center of our universe. Then, we learned about our home planet, Earth. We learned that the Earth is the perfect place for life to live and it circles around the sun. We also learned about the Moon. We learned that the Moon is Earth's best friend and circles the Earth as the Earth circles the Sun.
